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Central Office Updates

- Open Enrollment for the 2017-2018 school year begins December 1, 2016. By law in Michigan, charter school families must indicate their intent to re-enroll for the coming school year. NEW this year, each family will be receiving a personalized "Intent to Enroll" application in the mail. You must return this document to the school by February 24. 2017 in order to have a spot on the class roster next year. If you do not return this document, your student may lose his or her spot at GRCDC. Make sure to return that document ASAP! Thank you.
- Thanksgiving Break begins Wednesday, November 23rd. We have Wednesday, Thursday and Friday off from school.
- Winter Break is shortened this year due to the state mandated increase in the number of school days and another state mandate for schools to follow the common calendar that is set by our area intermediate school district (Kent ISD). Please be aware and plan family trips to coincide with the planned days off from school. This is a reminder for you as we made efforts to get the word out about this as early as June of this year via a letter that was mailed home, in the Link Letter and in the printed school calendar.



The Philosophy by Sarah Cooper

From my own classroom experience and current work with Discovery teachers, there seems to be a life cycle associated with projects in our Reggio Emilia inspired school. Projects, as we have come to appreciate them have phases, which vary by Discovery and project. In general I observe projects evolving throughout the school year.

August - October: A summer provocation or homework is sent home prior to the start of the school year and asks children to share parts of their identity. Children represent who they are and teachers use the information provided to build relationships, find commonalities among children and make connections to academic content. Teachers begin documenting how children respond to new provocations in a period of research that yields a documentation tool called the Ball Toss. It tracks the activities teachers plan and the resulting student responses. Under our way of working, teachers use student responses and their work to plan next steps. And the dance continues as if a ball is tossed back and forth between teachers and students. See the Ball Toss from Discovery B this year below:



November - December: During this time period, generally teachers follow children's theories found in the summer provocations or other classroom work. Teachers and children engage in conversations, writing, drawings, sculpting, painting, observation, etc. to uncover a meaningful context for teachers to connect academic and social skills to for the remainder of the year. The ball toss continues between children and teachers. And as a result, project goals begin to develop. Adults hypothesize possible challenges, outcomes and how academic content can be arranged to best facilitate learning. Typically teachers uncover social/emotional goals as well, often regarding collaboration and communication. Such a timeline is a general record of how children and teachers work to build meaningful long term projects. It is our Reggio inspired process and will no doubt evolve as we do. But, I urge you to seek out your child's current project goals and find a way to join! Start with your child's teacher. He or she is always your primary connection to the classroom, outside of your child.
