To edit your writing, use the checklist below. Read carefully!
When you're done, follow the instructions for how to present your research to your teacher.

Editing Checklist

<i>I used capital letters appropriately</i>		
Capitalize: The first word of each sentence		
Capitalize: Headings, titles, and proper nouns		
Random letters in the middle of words or sentences are NOT capitalized <i>weatheRinG</i>		
<i>I used commas appropriately</i>		
Comma after transition phrases <i>Overtime, _____</i> <i>After the experiment, _____</i>		
Commas to separate items in a list <i>Wind, water, and gravity can cause erosion</i>		
<i>I used appropriate punctuation</i>		
Question mark after a interrogative sentence (?) <i>Why does weathering happen more quickly here?</i>		
Exclamation point after an exclamatory sentence (!) <i>I could hardly believe my eyes!</i>		
Period after a declarative sentence (.) <i>The water moved the sediment.</i>
